Boris Kralj wrote an article for the Medical Post about the significant gender earnings gap in Canadian medicine. The article was based on research done with **CHEPA** colleagues **Meredith Vanstone**, **Arthur Sweetman**, and with Danielle O'Toole from McMaster's Department of Family Medicine. They found that female physicians in Canada on average earn about 9% less than their male colleagues. Kralj's commentary concludes that the gender pay gap in Canada's publicly funded and privately delivered medical system is real; pervasive, and is significant from both a statistical and policy perspective nationally and across provinces.

Feng Xie's <u>research</u> concluding that industrysponsored studies are more likely to suggest a new drug, treatment, or medical device is more cost-effective than do independent studies was profiled by the online medical publication Medscape and elsewhere.

Post-Doctoral Fellows

CHEPA welcomed two new post-doctoral fellows:

• Monica Molinaro is a <u>Banting Postdoctoral Fellow</u> in McMaster's <u>Department of Family Medicine</u> under the supervision of <u>Meredith Vanstone</u>. Molinaro has a PhD in Health and Rehabilitation Sciences from Western University. Her postdoctoral research critically analyzes primary care providers' stories of moral distress in caring for patients experiencing health needs related to social inequities, and elucidates patients' narratives of experiencing social inequities and seeking primary care. Her research interests lie in using qualitative methodologies

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to explore patient, health care provider, and caregiver experiences of providing and receiving care.

• Shitong Xie is a Postdoctoral Fellow in McMaster's Department of Health Research Methods, Evidence and Impact (HEI), under the supervision of Feng Xie. He has a PhD in health economics from Tianjin University, China, where he conducted a valuation study of the SF-6Dv2 quality of life evaluation instrument, and also contributed to evaluations and comparisons among utility elicitation approaches. Shitong is building on his past research assessing health-related quality of life and health utility measurement to include valuing the health of children and adolescents in Canada. He is also conducting systematic reviews of the epidemiologic, economic, and humanistic burden and the health utility values of cancers.
